



5. Most cherry (outside the higher elevations in the mountains) will have black knot and pitch pockets and will succumb and drop out with time. The shorter-lived cherry should fade and naturally release the CBO stems. While height growth is greater in cherry than cherrybark oak initially, the crown of black cherry allows filtered light to reach the adjacent cherrybark oak.
6. Consider the use of Tree and Shrub Site Preparation (490) practice in conjunction with this practice.
7. Use herbicides in accordance with the label. Tame grasses are required to be chemically eradicated prior to tree planting. Tame grasses include any prostrate or sod forming grasses including such species as tall fescue and Bermudagrass. Full field treatment is required to remove tame grasses prior to tree planting.
8. Refer to appropriate practice standard (314) Brush Management or (315) Herbaceous weed control for all herbicide use and evaluate with WIN-PST.
